Meet Marlene, a Port Chester resident at one of Feeding Westchester's 300 program partners, Caritas. Thank you for feeding people in Westchester.

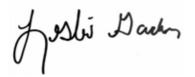

RAPID RESPONSE

Earlier this year, Feeding Westchester saw firsthand the adverse consequences of the longest government shutdown in U.S history. We helped feed federal employees, federal contractors, and 66,000 SNAP recipients in Westchester County. When family budgets were suddenly stretched thin and the need

for emergency food increased, Feeding Westchester was there to fill the gap. Many families had no other choice but to turn to our network of partners when their SNAP food assistance ran out.

SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) formerly known as Food Stamps

With your support, Feeding Westchester hosted a pop-up mobile food pantry at the Westchester County Center in White Plains and delivered emergency food boxes to Westchester County Airport for furloughed federal workers and anyone in the community who needed it. Karian Fletcher, from Yonkers, was thankful for the pop-up mobile food pantry after her husband went weeks without pay as a furloughed airport worker. "It's been very rough for us, but I'm thankful to Feeding Westchester for providing healthy food to help fill in the gap," says Fletcher.

BAGS OF PRODUCE FOR PRE-DIABETIC PATIENTS



Thanks to the support of generous donors we are helping to improve the lives of pre-diabetic patients. Through our work with a local federally-qualified health care clinic, we are providing bags of fresh produce to 100 pre-diabetic patients. Patients are screened for food insecurity and diabetes, and if they qualify, they receive bagged fresh produce twice a month. Free produce is critical to patients following their doctor-recommended diets. Without it they simply cannot afford to eat healthy. Look out for more news to come as we expand this work!
